

Good Samaritans who saved pilot to be honored Nov. 3

Two good Samaritans will be honored on Sunday, Nov. 3, at 11 a.m., at Santa Paula Airport in front of the hangars to the east of the Flight 126 Café/Hangar. Martin Mares of Oxnard and Gabriel Pacheco are being recognized for saving a pilot from a fiery crash in an industrial yard not far from the airport on Aug. 25.

The presentation, which is open to the public, is organized by Hal Provo of Westlake Village who wants to ensure the two men are rewarded for their actions. Attending the event will be officials and members of the Santa Paula Police and Ventura County Fire departments, among others, who have coordinated with Provo.

The good Samaritans were at the right place at the right time for Graham Pollock, 25, of Santa Paula, whose Pitts aircraft crashed into a 12th Street area industrial yard and burst into flames on Aug. 25.

Mares, who was on his way to Stryker Paintball & Airsoft when he saw the 12:30 p.m. crash, stopped and scrambled over the barbed-wire-topped fence to reach Pollock, who, despite his injuries, had exited the plane with his clothes aflame.

Pacheco also pulled over and passed a fire extinguisher from his own vehicle to Mares.

Mares carefully used the extinguisher to put out the flames by spraying around Pollock, allowing the fire retardant to bounce up onto the injured pilot's clothing.

Ventura County firefighters and Santa Paula Medical Center before being transferred to a Los Angeles-based burn unit where he is being treated. Since the accident, Provo has been deter-

mined to publicly honor Mares and Pacheco and present them with community donations to reward them for their concern for others.

"I would just ask, and people would give me money," said Provo, who has an aircraft at Santa Paula Airport. "Both of them could have just kept going or stopped and taken pictures to post on social media, but instead they jumped right in" and coordinated the rescue.

"It's pretty great," said Rose Vanoni, Aviation Museum of Santa Paula director of operations. "We're really excited to be a part of it to recognize those real-life heroes."

Vanoni said she did not know Provo, who is acquainted with her father, until he introduced himself while she was working with her dad on her grandfather's truck at the airport.

Provo told them he wanted to ensure that Mares and Pacheco are recognized for their lifesaving actions.

The Aviation Museum of Santa Paula is providing a stage and sound system for the presentation on Nov. 3, according to Vanoni. Also, "we're doing our normal First Sunday Open House," offering hangar tours, airplane rides, the annual November Food Drive for needy families, and this month featuring the Ventura County Chevy Club, she noted. "There's going to be a lot happening!" Typically, 200 or more people attend the airport's First Sunday of the Month event, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The Aviation Museum is at 800 E. Santa Maria St., Santa Paula.

Big money enters City Council District 5 race

Big money has entered the race for the Santa Paula District 5 City Council seat, with funding benefiting two of the three candidates.

Incumbent Leslie Cornejo, now serving as mayor and owner of a travel agency, is running for the newly carved District 5 seat against Christina Eilar and Tim Eubanks.

Voters will decide the one City Council seat in the Nov. 5 General Election.

District 1 Councilman Andy Sobel did not run for re-election and Gabriela "Gabby" Ornelas, a Santa Paula Unified School District trustee, filed — with no opponents. She will be seated on the council in December.

Eilar, a digital services specialist at the Art Center College of Design, served as an appointed interim on the Blanchard Community Library Board for 14 months and is former president of Santa Paula Latino Town Hall.

Timothy Eubanks is in security management and has been an outspoken critic of the City Council and city staff on social media. He is running a grassroots campaign and has not filed financial reports.

According to an Oct. 18 campaign filing, triggered by

a single donation over \$1,000, Cornejo's treasurer Mary Deines reported that the California Real Estate Political Action Committee donated \$2,500 to the campaign.

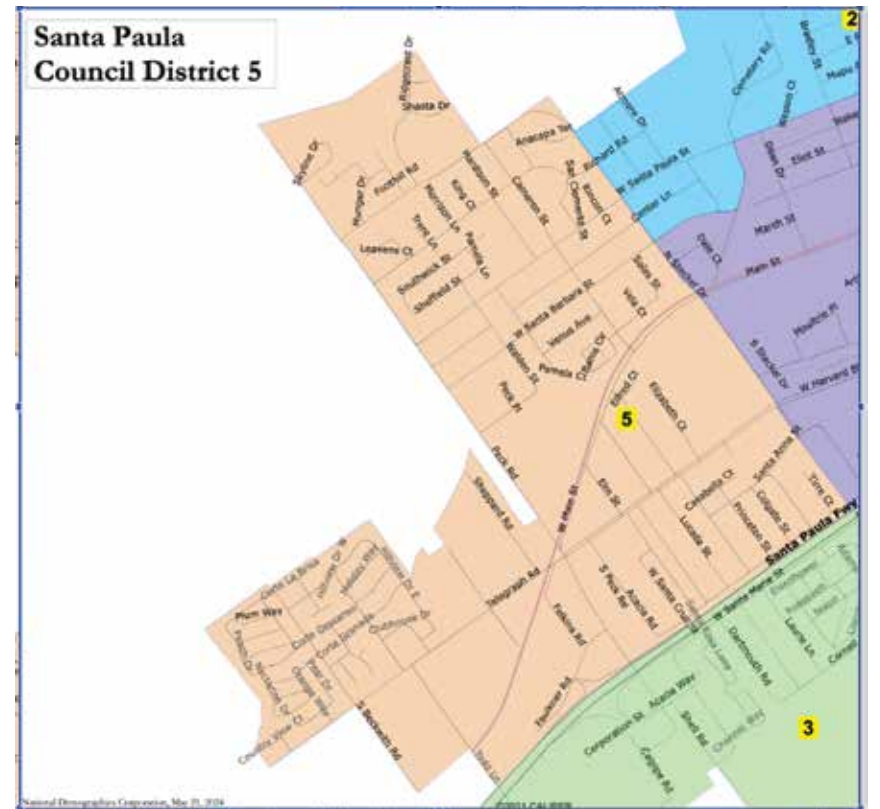
The purpose of the organization is to develop and promote programs and services that will enhance the members' "freedom and ability to conduct their individual businesses successfully with integrity and competency, and through collective action, to promote real property ownership and the preservation of real property rights."

The report also noted other donations, bringing Cornejo's total campaign account to \$13,267. Spending includes \$311.76 for door hangers printed by Crane Printing; \$1,696 for advertising in the Santa Paula Times; \$100 for an Idaho graphic artist; and \$325 in office supplies purchased by Cornejo.

Cornejo's ending campaign account balance as of the filing was \$8,376.

The Friends of CAUSE Action Fund filed an Independent Expenditure Report on Oct. 14, showing they spent an estimated total of \$9,193 in support of Eilar for field program expenses. CAUSE is the acronym for Central Coast Alliance United for a Sustainable Economy.

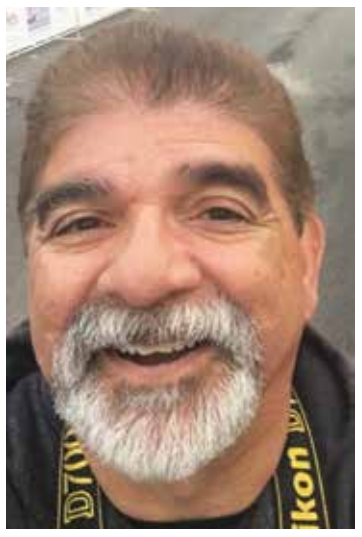
Santa Paula Times Sports photographers preserve the past

There are individuals who devote their time to help preserve memories for others. They write stories, paint portraits, take videos and photographs, among other things. Thanks to individuals like these, a portion of the memories created from a century of football at Santa Paula High School has been preserved.

I don't know who gets credit for the photos taken those early years of football at the high school, the sports reporter of the local newspaper or the yearbook staff of El Solano, but photos exist of those first years.

Now, if someone wants to view those early photos, the easiest and quickest way to access them is to look through editions of El Solanos

from the past 100 years. Another source are the countless scrapbooks (they exist, but their location is unknown) that were made possible mostly due to the dedication of the staff of the local newspaper at the time.

The current Sports editor for the Santa Paula Times, Matthew Khan, and the previous Sports editor, Dan Diaz, have provided the community with many action photos on the newspaper's Sports pages for the past several years, documenting local athletes' accomplishments.

It is difficult to go back too far and acknowledge everyone who recorded the activities of local athletes on film.

For this story, I will go back to the late 1970s. About 1979, Don Johnson became publisher of The Santa Paula Daily Chronicle. The local newspaper had a full-time Sports editor who provided

coverage of local sports events throughout the week. Along with the Sports editor, Don attended many of the sports events with his trusty camera to assist in taking pictures of the events.

As the story goes, he would spend Saturday mornings developing a bag full of film taken the week before. Initially, the photos were given to individuals at no charge, but the response and demand from the public were so overwhelming, a charge had to be added.

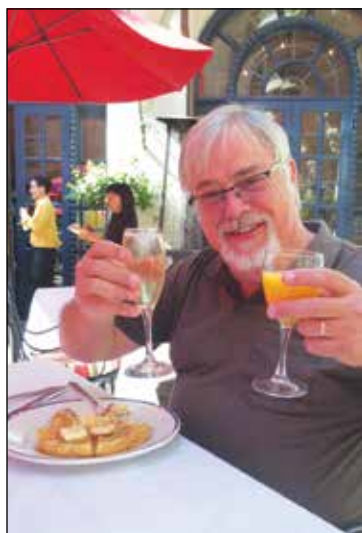
In December 1992, the Santa Paula Daily Chronicle closed its doors for good. In January

1993, Don and Debbie Johnson opened the doors of a new community newspaper, The Santa Paula Times.

For the next 25 years, Pat Untiedt, followed by Brian D. Wilson, served as Sports editors. Many athletes of that era fondly remember Pat and Brian for the effort and devotion they displayed in their craft.

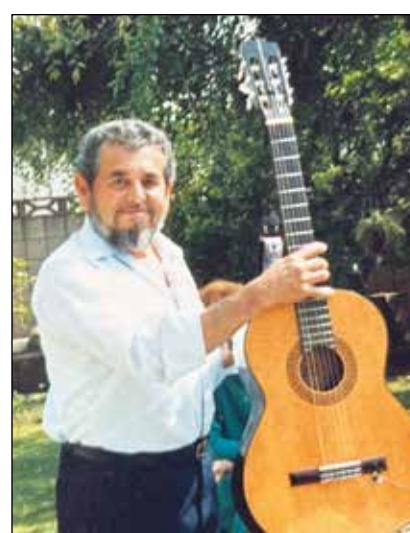
Carl will be remembered as a Beloved Husband, Father, Son, Brother, Uncle, Cousin and Friend.

According to Fair Political Practices filing guidelines, "An 'independent expenditure' is an expenditure made in connection with a communication (example, a billboard, advertisement, or mailing) that expressly advocates the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate or the qualification, passage, or defeat of a clearly identified measure.

An independent expenditure is a payment that is not made to — or at the behest of — the affected candidate or committee."

Eilar shared a statement posted on social media, noting: "If elected, I do want my contributions to the City Council to result in meaningful change for my community, and I do intend to work with allies on important issues like housing, livable wages, access to healthcare and education, economic opportunities and workforce development, environmental justice, working together to grow a green economy and dignity and respect for all, including marginalized and minority identities. I am proud to run my campaign with the support of organizations aligned with these principles."

The next official campaign financial filing deadline is Oct. 24.

tos and share them. One such individual was Cecil Preciado, a member of the Santa Paula High School Class of 1948. His obituary in 2021 stated, "... but most of all, Cecil Preciado will be remembered for taking pictures and giving them away as presents. In everyday Santa Paula life, it was customary to see Cecil wearing his fabled camera vest filled to the brim with rolls of film, snapping pictures of parades, football games, graduation ceremonies... And he always did this with a smile."

Enter the digital age. If a

person goes online and enters "Flickr," they will come to a site that has photos submitted by individual photographers. After they click "Search People" and type the name "Tony Salas," they will come to a page that has many sites with the name "Tony Salas." A person will have to click on the site that has the American flag.

Other identifying information listed are joined Mar2009; Capt26vnc; and, 98.5 K photos. This is the site of Tony Salas who started taking pictures of his daughter when she was a

cheerleader for the Cardinals and decided to continue taking photos and sharing them online. For the past 15 years, Tony has been taking photos of events at his alma mater and sharing them online. Anyone can access these photos and download them at no cost. According to the site, Tony has taken close to 100,000 photos over the last decade and a half.

An additional contribution of the digital age is the existence of a television station at Santa Paula High School — SPUSD KARDTV — accessed on YouTube. This site is staffed by students and reports on all student activities at the local high school, including all sports events. If someone missed last week's football game, they can go to SPUSD KARD TV and watch a video recording of the game.

Thanks to the staff — past and present — at Santa Paula High School, The Santa Paula Times, Blanchard Community Library, and the Santa Paula Historical Society, the local history of Santa Paula is well preserved.

4. The current city Budget is presently strained to the max. Just as our own personal budgets are strained by inflation, the city budget, too, is affected by inflation.

If Measure R passes, does our involvement as citizens cease? My thought is "ABSOLUTELY NOT." With the passage of this particular tax we will have more money staying in Santa Paula.

As citizens we need to continue to study and understand the city budget, listen to City Council meetings, volunteer to help the city where possible and make sure, by way of public input, that we expect the city to follow the desired public input for the use of the money received from MEASURE R.

To the Editor: The city of Santa Paula has adopted a questionable strategy negatively affecting residents and local businesses: a new 1% sales tax increase, titled the City of Santa Paula Streets, Pothole Repair, City Services Measure - Measure R.

At a time when actual inflation is out of control, with soaring costs for rent, fuel, groceries, utilities, and insurance, their response is to raise the local sales tax rate.

Local businesses are already teetering on extinction, with several closing in the past month. A common complaint is that Santa Paula residents prefer to shop in neighboring cities rather than locally.

Of course not!

Will new businesses look to establish roots in Santa Paula?

Hardly. Implementing Measure R will leave Santa Paula with the highest sales tax in Ventura County. This could lead to decreased revenue, as more residents shop elsewhere, and local businesses struggle to remain open.

The most significant impact will be felt by low-income residents, seniors, and others on fixed incomes, as their purchasing power diminishes further.

In 2016, voters passed Measure T, also a 1% increase in the sales tax, supposedly to address roads, public safety, and youth programs.

The revenue went directly into the General Fund with few concrete results. Shortly after Measure T passed, all city employees received a 15% pay raise funded in part by, you guessed it, Measure T revenue.

Measure R's title includes "City Services." Like Measure T, all revenue will go to the General Fund, essentially to be used for anything. And there is no end to this increase.

The City Council placed Measure R on the ballot following a bizarre interpretation of an unrelated and misleading survey, highlighting the council's complete lack of transparency. The survey asked respondents to prioritize basic city services, such as road repair, public safety, etc.

priorities. A grand deception, indeed!

The Council needs to focus on providing basic services we already pay for and live within its budget. Throwing more money at the problem is not a solution. Please VOTE NO on MEASURE R.

Pursuant to California Labor Code section 1720 et seq., it shall be mandatory upon the Contractor to whom the Contract is awarded, and upon any subcontractor under such Contractor, to pay not less than the said specified rates to all workers employed by them in the execution of the Contract.

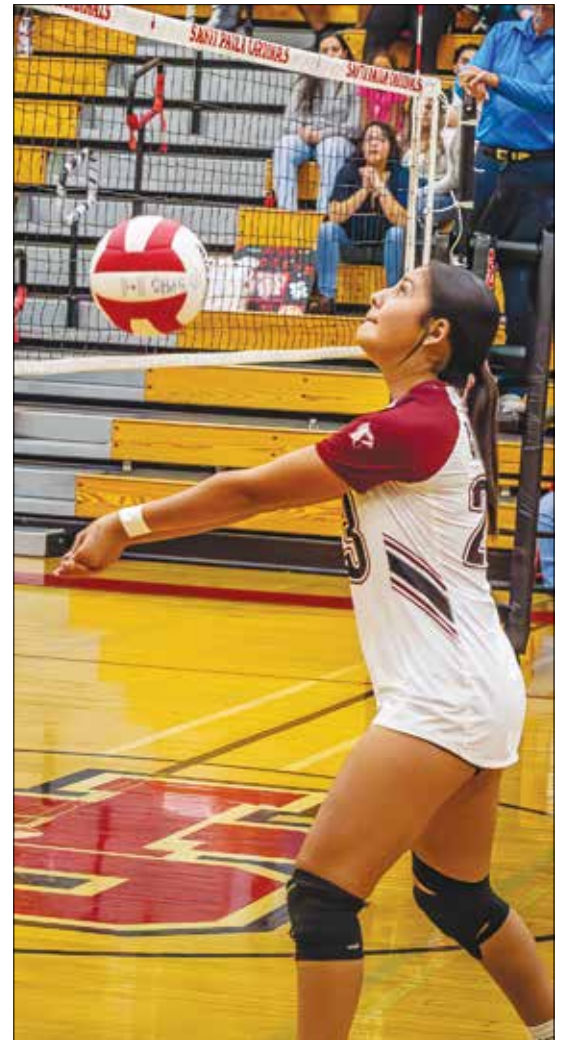
